

## High School Town Hall – Hybrid Learning Model September 3, 2020

### Hybrid schedule:

- Last name A-L approx. 575 students (Red team)
- Last name M-Z approx. 560 students (Gold team)
- Class sizes are approx. 10-15 students per class with some exceptions.
- Last name M-Z will log on and follow their schedule on Tuesday, 9/8/2020. Students should check email and ProgressBook to join Google Classroom for each class and can get Zoom/livestream instructions.
- Wednesdays – All students at home; students will follow their class schedule. Deep cleaning will take place in the building.

### Bell schedule:

- 9 periods per day; 42 minutes per period.
- No homeroom; first period is extended to include the homeroom period for announcements.
- Daily announcements can be found on high school website: <https://www.bbhcsc.org/DailyAnnouncements.aspx>, Twitter and Friday newsletter/email that is emailed to students and parents.
- 7:30am warning bell; first period begins at 7:35am.
- 2:50am dismissal bell.
- Most math and science classes are 1½ periods based on recommendation for at least 50 minutes of instruction for those subjects. Some exceptions apply.

### General Info

- Students should follow their class schedule every day, whether in class or from home.
- Attendance will be taken daily (in class and via Zoom, livestream).
- The goal is not to have students online all day, but they will have chunks of time online throughout the day when learning from home.
- There will be brain breaks built into the day.

- Based on Spring 2020 learning from home, many students did not participate online during the day and then would submit assignments late at night. The high school wants the students to have a healthy, daily routine by having them follow their schedule from home so that they are not doing schoolwork late at night.

### **Cuyahoga County Board of Health Guidelines**

BBH follows the Cuyahoga County Board of Health guidelines and the best way for the school to stay open is to follow the CCBOH guidelines. Hand sanitizer is available in the school, but the school encourages everyone to wash their hands with soap and water.

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## **Social Distancing and PPE**

- Students and visitors must wear masks at all times
  - Bandanas and fleece masks are not allowed
- We all need to do our part
  - Eliminate unnecessary gatherings
  - Wash your hands
  - Follow the new rules
- This is not about your opinion on masks, social distancing, or COVID-19 it is about keeping our school open for our students

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### **Large Gatherings Eliminated**

- The high school is eliminating unnecessary gatherings. Teachers will create videos and post them for a virtual open house.
- The high school will need to do contact tracing with any positive COVID-19 cases, so a decrease in gatherings will help with contact tracing and determining which students/staff need to quarantine.
- There will be markings in the building to keep foot traffic moving in the same direction.

### **Assessing COVID-19 & Morning Protocol**

- Parents are being asked to take their child(ren)'s temperature before heading to school in the morning. Parents are also being asked to pay attention to symptoms of their family members.
- Temperatures will be taken again by high school staff then they arrive to school.
- 2 clinics are set up at the high school:
  - One for COVID-19 related issues (fever, symptomatic)
  - One for non-COVID-19 related issues (taking medication, injury, etc.)
- The school will call home if there's a fever (or they are symptomatic) to have the student picked up.

- Students arriving by car will enter the school through the auditorium entrance or gym entrance.
  - Students arriving by bus will enter the school through the main doors.
  - 30 buses will be transporting students to/fro school each day. For parents picking up their child(ren), please do so at middle school lot between middle school and stadium. Students can walk down the hill, along the sidewalk/walkway to get to middle school lot. Cars cannot go up the hill until 2:45pm.

## School Drop-Off / Transportation

## Athletics

- We are asking families to sit together.
- CCBOH and OHSAA will do site visits during games to make sure BBH is following guidelines.

## Lunch and Study Halls

For the first day of in person learning, students will be asked to pick a seat at lunch and study hall and will be required to stay there so that seating charts can be created for contact tracing.

## Open Campus Privilege

- This is a privilege, not a right.
- Must be in good academic standing in 10<sup>th</sup>-12<sup>th</sup> grade.
- This has been established to reduce the size of lunch and study halls.
- Students do not need to leave every day.
- Students will get an email confirmation that they've been granted this privilege.
- Students will need to scan in and out of building.
